

This quick start guide shows the basics on how to set preferences, submit a daily fishing trip, and report harvest using FACTS™ for the MD charter fishery. Refer to the complete user quide for more details.

Best Reporting Practices:

- Submit a trip start hail before you leave the dock.
- Submit a trip end hail *before* you return to the dock.
- Accurately report **all** harvest, including fish released and bait kept for live lining.
- Trip start hails should be revised if your angler count, anticipated landing time, or landing location changes. If there is a change in angler count, revisions should be sent right away. All other changes should be made at least 30 minutes prior to a new landing time and/or location.

Save Time! Use the **My Account** menu to customize your account, making the reporting process faster with saved preferences that pre-fill your trip hails.







Your saved preferences can be selected in a drop down menu

- Store addresses of your frequent landing locations
- Choose *vessels* you regularly use
- Save your favorite NOAA codes
- Choose your frequently used gears types
- Save commonly caught species

Reporting through the Call Center (1-855-390-2722):

For your <u>Start Hail</u>, the representative will ask you to provide the following information: Username, vessel, gear type, anticipated landing time (24-hr clock), anticipated landing location, and angler count.

For your trip *End Hail*, the representative will ask you to provide the following information:

- Username
- Vessel
- Gear type
- Gear method if using hook and line (jigging, live lining, chumming, or trolling)
- Gear effort details (e.g. how many rods)
- Landing time (24-hr clock)
- · Landing location

- Angler count
- Species caught
- Count and weight for each species caught
- Catch disposition (kept, kept filleted, kept for bait, or released)
- For released striped bass you will be asked hooking location (shallow or deep)
- For all released fish you will be asked a size class
- · Reason for releasing a legal sized fish
