Butterflies and skippers are some of our more colorful and well-noticed pollinators! Located here are several photos of these fancy flighted friends along with several facts about their species. Using these photos and facts, you can answer the questions below and find your first clue! Please show your completed sheet to a Park Store attendant to receive your stamp!

1.	I look like one of my colleagues but that is just for self-defense, if I camouflage myself as one of them, it will hopefully make predators think twice about eating me. (The last letter is the first of the clue)
2.	I rely on the Paw Paw tree, as part of my life cycle and my proboscis is shorter than others of my species, which means I prefer shorter, flatter, flowers. Perhaps if you take a trip over to Milburn landing you might see me! (There are three of this letter in the answer and you'll use it twice in the clue)
3.	I have been in an age long struggle with my host plant but I need it to survive. I have even been able to adapt its poison into my own body to repel predators, pretty smart eh? (The letter you'll need is in the middle of an abbreviation for a day of the week)
4.	You can identify me by my white/silver spot and my hook like antennae! (The letter you need has taken Q's place between these two letters in the alphabet, singing the song might help!)
5.	We have mentioned three of these species you can find within the park, named so because they have a feature similar to that of a birds. (The letter you need is at the start of the tail)
