Invasive Species

- Invasive species are organisms that becomes overpopulated and can harm its new environment which can harm other organisms
- Some of the organisms that can be harmed by invasive species are those known as pollinator plants
- A pollinator is an animal that moves pollen from flower to flower to help fertilization
- If an invasive species is growing next to a pollinator plant, this could cause it to die from lack of sunlight or nutrients, and would have a harmful effect on the environment

Pollinators

- Important pollinators that are native to Maryland are bees, butterflies, ants, beetles, flies, moths, wasps, and the ruby-throated hummingbird
- Bees are the most important pollinator, with over 400 different species being found in Maryland
- While a lot of these bugs could be seen as creepy crawlys and a little scary, they are important for the environment and need to be protected
