DID YOU KNOW there's a Maryland state flower? Since 1918, it has been *Rudbeckia hirta*, the black-eyed Susan. It's a member of the *Asteraceae*, or sunflower family. Flowers measure 2-3 inches across, with yellow-orange petals encircling a dark brown spherical center. They are commonly found in fields and along roadsides, blooming between June and October, and are native to the United States east of the Rocky Mountains.

POLLINATORS TO LOOK FOR INCLUDE:

Monarch butterfly, eastern tiger swallowtail butterfly, painted lady butterfly, yellow skipper, bumble bees, moths, and more!

NATIVE PLANTS TO LOOK FOR INCLUDE:

Black-eyed Susans (six different types,) common milkweed, butterfly weed, 'Cheyenne Spirit' coneflower, 'Pica bella' coneflower, New York ironweed, Joe pye weed, swamp milkweed, swamp sunflower, oxeye sunflower, seaside goldenrod.

Please do not disturb the pollinators while taking photos! They're much more interested in the flowers than in you. You probably don't like to be bothered while you're eating your favorite meal...and neither do they.

Tips for taking photos:

- Pollinators move quickly. Choose a spot and wait for them to come nearby. Sudden movements can scare them away.
- Be aware of where the sun is positioned. Shadows don't usually make for good photos.
- Remember the background area of your photo. You probably don't want to showcase your big toe or that piece of litter in your masterpiece.
- Try taking photos from different angles. What does it look like while standing up, sitting down, laying on the ground?


Entries must be submitted by **September 23, 2022**. The Bonus Quest competition winner will be announced **October 7, 2022**.
